

SEA-TECH Skills Center Internships Underway

SEA-TECH students received paid internships through a Youth Works Grant provided by the Workforce Development Council's Eastern Washington Partnership. Students performed 160 hours of work for a local business over an eight-week period.

The grant will provide internships through Spring 2016 for nineteen SEA-TECH students studying Digital Media Technology, Advanced Manufacturing and Welding, Electrical Systems Technology and Health Science.

Jorge Garcia (Touchet) is interning with Doyle Electric, Inc. on his way to becoming a full-time electrician through an apprenticeship program.

Trenton Mangarero (Wa-Hi), is interning with Walla Walla's Web-Weavers, working on a variety of web development projects.
